## Roundtables

Roundtables offer a productive setting to stimulate discussion on a given topic or question, often in relation to contemporary social issues.

In convening events of this kind, CIKH draws together expertise from different areas of the University of Cambridge as well as academic visitors to provide cross-disciplinary perspectives. Where appropriate external speakers from policy, faith and other sectors are also enlisted.

Invited table talks of up to 20 minutes are followed by a structured conversation, chaired by one of the CIKH team. This approach enables wide-ranging discussion, with all attendees encouraged to reflect on the matter in hand and add to the depth of insight.

Themes have included faith in peacebuilding, religion in public space, and contexts of conflict.

## Guest lectures

CIKH facilitates invitations to University of Cambridge academics to deliver guest lectures and keynote talks at external events. Where a given speaker is not available, we may suggest alternatives to suit the specific theme and/or context you wish to address.

On occasion, CIKH also hosts individuals from partner organisations to deliver a keynote lecture on a relevant topic. Such events may be recorded, capturing key insights for future reference.



## Bulletins

CIKH maintains regular bulletins to keep audiences in Cambridge and further afield apprised of new work and opportunities.

The selection includes:

- Forum notices (a regular communication with Research Forum members)
- Monthly bulletin (communicating locally and with programme alumni)
- Quarterly newsletter (with research highlights and upcoming events)

A bulletin for partner organisations is due to launch in 2025.

Core notices are accompanied by notices from friends, chosen for relevance to the audiences in hand. Partner organisations are welcome to submit notices for consideration.
